Wednesday, May 26

On Wednesday morning, we'll participate in a memorial service to remember our late classmates. A luncheon will be served under a tent, and immediately afterward there will be a class meeting for Radcliffe classmates. In the afternoon we will assemble small-group (15-25 participants each) discussions on a variety of topics. These discussions will be introspective and very interactive, whereas the symposia will feature presentations from a stage, with questions from the audience.
